To Whom It May Concern:

It my pleasure to write this recommendation for the American Orchestra Conductor, Barry Kolman

Maestro Kolman has conducted The State Philharmonic, Kosice on several occasions. He was our guest conductor in 1993 during our annual Sacred Music Festival. He has recorded three compact disks with our Orchestra as well. As a clarinetist, I was guest soloist with the Shenandoah Symphony Orchestra in Lexington where Mr. Kolman is Music Director and Conductor. In every situation, I have known him to be an outstanding musician.

Mr. Kolman's baton technique is fluent, clear and concise; his knowledge of the music is always complete and well studied, and his feel for the music itself is always expressive and personal. He achieves an immediate rapport and respect with his musicians whether he is at home in Virginia or overseas. He is extremely efficient with rehearsal time, keeping his instructions and comments brief and to the point. He is articulate, knows what he wants, and is able to draw out great music from his players. His résumé is extensive and very impressive. In Virginia, Mr. Kolman is well respected by his own orchestra musicians who thoroughly appreciate his musicianship as well as his sense of humor. They sincerely enjoy playing for him.

His first recording with The State Philharmonic, Kosice was of Anton Rubinstein's Third and Fifth Symphonies. The orchestral parts of the Third Symphony were lost. Mr. Kolman found the score and wrote out and edited all the parts. His second recording contained music of the American, George Antheil. He recorded a third CD with us of Hollywood film music composed by Max Steiner. This was a 2-year project for him in which the final result was a CD of two orchestral suites which Mr. Kolman created and extracted from the actual Hollywood score. With each recording, Mr. Kolman was thorough with his knowledge of some very complicated scores and worked calmly and efficiently while under the pressure of producing an excellent disk.

His concert performance with us was very successful and received an excellent review from the press. His varied program included an early composition of Webern as well as a Schubert Mass which involved his working closely with our local choral musicians.

There is no doubt in my mind that Mr. Kolman is a talented and accomplished conductor. I would be pleased to speak about his outstanding qualifications by phone if you wish. I recommend Mr. Barry Kolman for attention without hesitation.
